

## **AdMUDial-up Service Instructions**

### **NOTE:**

**These dial-up accounts are different from your e-mail accounts thus they may have different usernames and password.**

### ***I. Account/User Names:***

Account/username is your first initial immediately followed by your complete last name. For users that happen to have the same name configuration as an existing account, the middle and second (if any) name initials may also be used.

Example:

Name: Bartolome Sakay  
Username: bsakay

### ***II. Passwords***

The very first time you log in, use the temporary password given to you. You will also receive a message informing you that your password has expired and you will be asked to enter a new password.

If a window appears and you are asked for a logon domain, key in "rasman".

*Passwords must be at least 6 characters long.*

### ***III. Dial-up Specifics***

Peak hours: 6:00pm to 12:00am daily

*Session time limits*

Peak hours: 1 hour

Off hours: 2 hours

Monthly time limit: 30 hours

Additional hours can be purchased in three hour chunks for P100.00 at Faura 313.

**Ateneo dial-up number: 426-5920**

This is a trunk-hunting line. There currently are a total of 24 dialup lines.

### ***IV. How to set-up a dial-up connection on MS Windows:***

A. *Install and configure your modem:*

1. Consult your modem's user manual on how to connect to your computer and a phone line.
2. After connecting your modem, switch it on together with your computer. Click on the Windows [Start](#) button, go to [Settings](#) then click [Control Panel](#)

3. The **Control Panel** window will open. Double-click the **Add New Hardware** icon and follow the instructions. Consult your modem's user manual for more details.

*B. Configure a Windows dial-up connection:*

*1. Configure a Windows 95/98 dial-up connection*

- a. Click on the Windows **Start** button, go to **Programs > Accessories > Communications**, and then click on **Dial-up Networking**
- b. The **Dial-up Networking** window appears. Double-click the **Make New Connection** icon.
- c. The **Make a New Connection** window appears.
- d. Type in a suitable name for the connection, make sure your modem is the selected device, and click **Next**
- e. You can leave the area code blank in the next window and put in the dial-up number of Ateneo (426-5920) and click **Next**
- f. A message then appears indicating that you've successfully created a new connection. Click **Finish**. Your new connection will now be visible as an icon in the **Dial-up Networking** window

*2. Configure a Windows XP dial-up connection:*

- a. Click on the Windows **Start** button, select **Control Panel**, click **Network and Internet Connections**, double-click the **Network Connections** icon.
- b. On the left-hand portion of the screen, click the **Create a new connection** icon.
- c. The **New Connection Wizard** window appears. Click **Next**
- d. Select the **Connect to the Internet** radio button. Click **Next**
- e. Select the **Setup my connection manually** radio button. Click **Next**
- f. Select the **Connect using a dial-up modem** radio button. Click **Next**
- g. In the **ISP Name** field, type in a suitable connection name. Click **Next**
- h. In the **Phone number** field, type in the dial-up number of Ateneo (426-5920). Click **Next**
- i. The Internet Account Information screen appears.
  - i. In the **Username** field, type your username.
  - ii. In the **Password** field, type your password.
  - iii. In the **confirm password** field, retype your password. Click **Next**
- j. Check the box beside **Add a shortcut to this connection to my desktop** if you want to add a desktop shortcut. Click **Finish**

*C. Configure MS Internet Explorer for browsing the Web:*

1. Click on the Windows **Start** button, go to **Settings** and then click on **Control Panel**
2. The **Control Panel** window appears. Double-click the **Internet Options** icon.
3. The **Internet Properties** window appears. Click the **Connections** tab.
4. In the **Dial-up and Virtual Private Network settings** section, double-click on the connection you just created for the AdMU Dial-Up Service.
5. A dial-up settings window will open. In the proxy server section, check the box for **Use automatic configuration script** and enter in the box provided:

6. Click **OK** for all the open windows and you are now ready to connect.

*D. Connect to the AdMU Dial-up Service:*

1. Doubleclick the icon of your new connection.
2. Input your username and password in the **Connect To** window then click on **Connect** or press **Enter**.

Outlook Express and other similar mail clients can also be used. Just set in the appropriate SMTP and IMAP/POP server. Consult the CNG website for more details on this. To use ICQ, set the ICQ configuration to use the SOCKS server.

15 minutes, 10 minutes, and 2 minutes before the end of your allocated time, you will receive warning messages indicating the number of minutes you have left prior to disconnection only if you have Winpopup installed and running

To configure Winpopup for MS Windows 95/98,

1. Click **Start**, then point to **Settings**, click **Taskbar**
2. The **Taskbar Properties** window appears, click on the **Start Menu Programs** tab.
3. Click **Add**
4. The **Create New Shortcut** window appears, enter the following line: winpopup.exe
5. Click **Next**, then doubleclick the startup folder or select the folder you want to put the program in.
6. Type the name that you want to see on the startup menu, and then click **Finish**. When you restart Windows 95/98, winpopup will load automatically.
